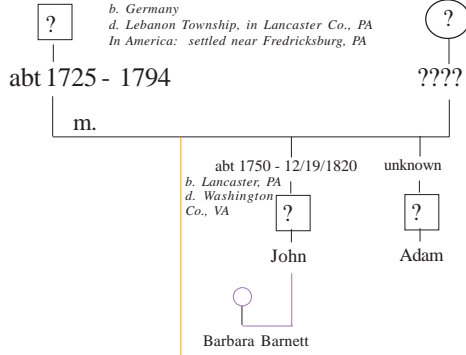

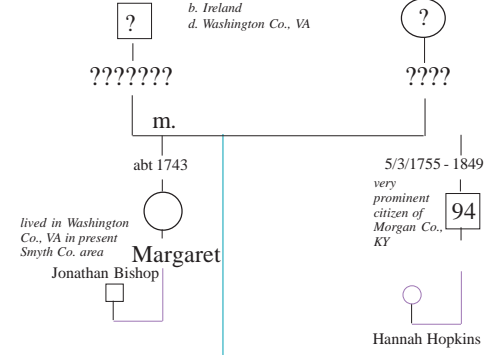

Speculation: John A. M. Booher is the son of Michael Booher and Mary Houser. *Basis for speculation:* Martin Booher Sr. had 7 sons. Of those 7 sons, to the older 5 of them, he bequeathed in his will land holdings in the Sullivan County, Tennessee area. To the youngest son he bequeathed a monetary inheritance. To the other two sons, Samuel and Michael, Martin bequeathed land in Scott Co, VA. From the census records, we find that Samuel and his wife Mary lived in Scott Co., where Samuel died at a young age. Mary and her children continued to live in Scott Co., as evidenced by census records of 1850 and 1860. Michael, on the other hand, sold his land holdings and moved to Robertson, TN. Michael and his wife Mary can be followed through census records for several decades, still living in Robertson, TN. In Estillville, Scott Co., VA, we find in 1860 a son of Samuel, John A. and his wife, Sarah C. Sproles, and family. We also find, in close proximity, John A. M. and his wife, Sarah, and family. The only piece of evidence that would cast doubt on the assumption that John A.M. is the son of Michael is the census of 1860, because a John of the appropriate age is in the household of Michael and Mary in Robertson, TN during that same census year. A plausible explanation does exist, however. The census in Estillville, Scott Co., VA was taken in June. The census in Robertson, TN was taken in October. There is a possibility that John was visiting his parents, perhaps to help with harvest, when the census taker arrived at their home. At this time, I can find no other reasonable explanation for the identify of John A.M. and the John in the home of Michael and Mary in TN in 1860.

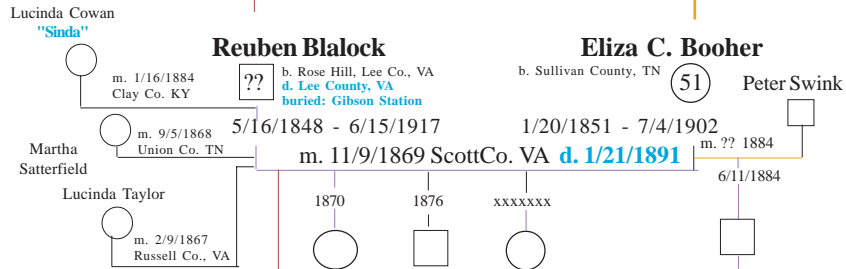

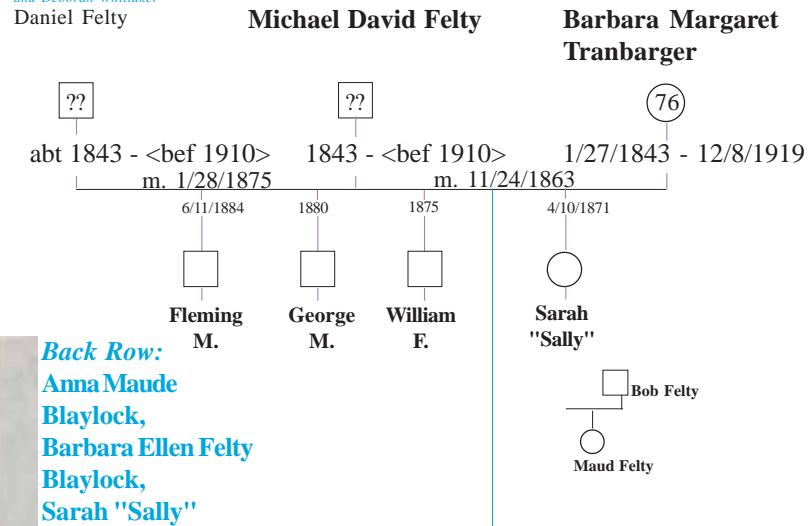
