Medical history: Arthur had a stroke when he was approximately in his 50s. He had a full recovery except for a slight pull at the corner of his mouth. Arthur died of old age.

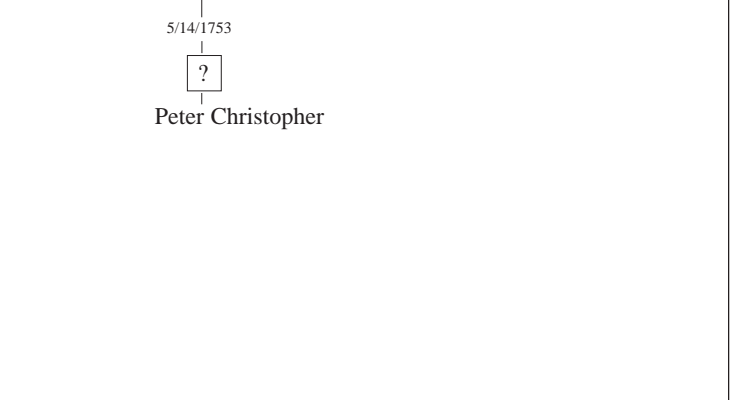

Many people left Germany, especially from the Palatine area, in the early to mid-1700's. Johan Michael Braun was one. He was born Jan 15, 1724 and according to Rupp's "Thirty Thousand Immigrants", he arrived at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on Sept. 26, 1737. He had sailed on the ship, "Saint Andrew Galley", John Stedham, Master.

He settled in East Hanover, Lebanon Twp, Lancaster Co, Pennsylvania. (Later Dauphin Co, and now Lebanon Co.) He met Anna Margaret Karger who lived in the town of Warwick, also in Lancaster Co. They were married on Jan 26, 1746 in the Hill Evangelical Lutheran Church by Reverend John Casper Stoever.

Michael and Anna farmed in East Hanover. They had a mill on their property that was erected at Sahara Creek and Michael was a blacksmith.

Michael died in Lebanon Twp, Lancaster Co, Pennsylvania and he was buried in Bindagle's Church Cemetery north of Palmyra with the following inscription on his tombstone: Michael Brown b. 5. Jan, 1724 d. 13 Mar, 1785 2nd Lt., 8th Co, 6th Batt. Lancaster Co Militia (Revolutionary War)

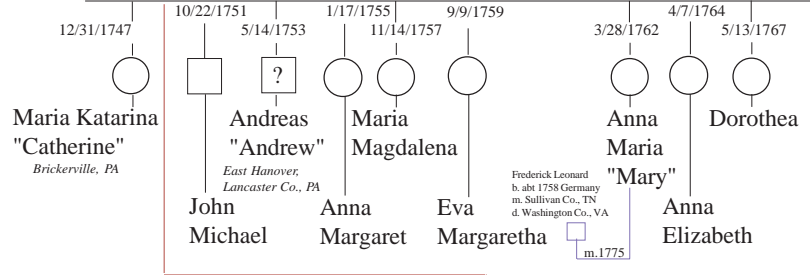

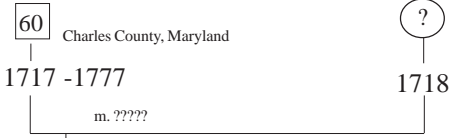

Brown (son of Christopher Brown and Anna Maria Rader), the entire family of Johan Michael Brown, married sons, married daughters, single daughters and their families all moved from Hanover Township, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania to Montgomery County, VA (now Wythe Co.) in 1785. The families of Andrew Brown, Christopher Brown, Michael Brown, Nicholas Cassell (wife Margaret Brown) and Frederick Leonard (wife Mary Brown) settled in an area that would become the community of St. Johns Lutheran Church.

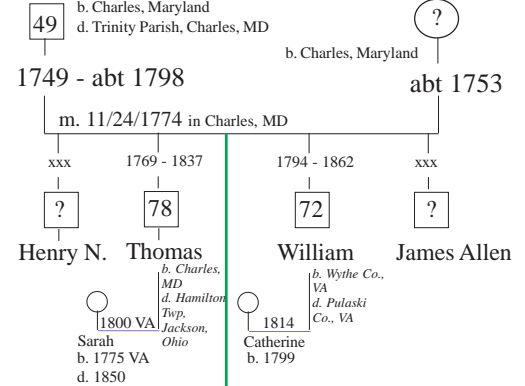

Sam said his father came from Ireland during the potato famine of the 1840s and was living in Kentucky, working on the railroad. Sam's father was killed in an accident when Sam was 4-years-old. His mother, Catherine, moved back home, and his grandmother helped raise him. --jk

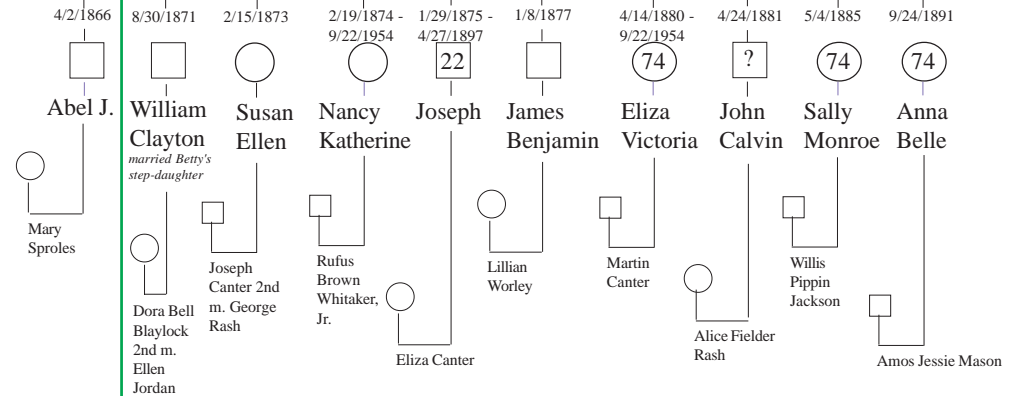

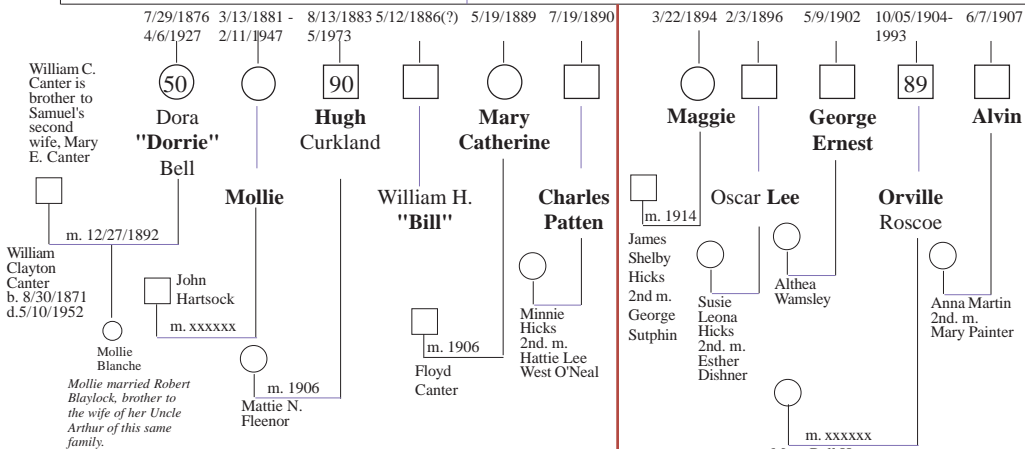

According to family legend, Arthur was paid a wage and a half when he worked for the railroad, because he could carry two railroad ties at one time. Another family story reports a time when a taxi cab had a flat tire on the road near his home and the driver had no tire jack in the car. So, Arthur held up the car while the driver changed the tire. Arthur was a very quiet man who died of old age. -- Judy Blaylock

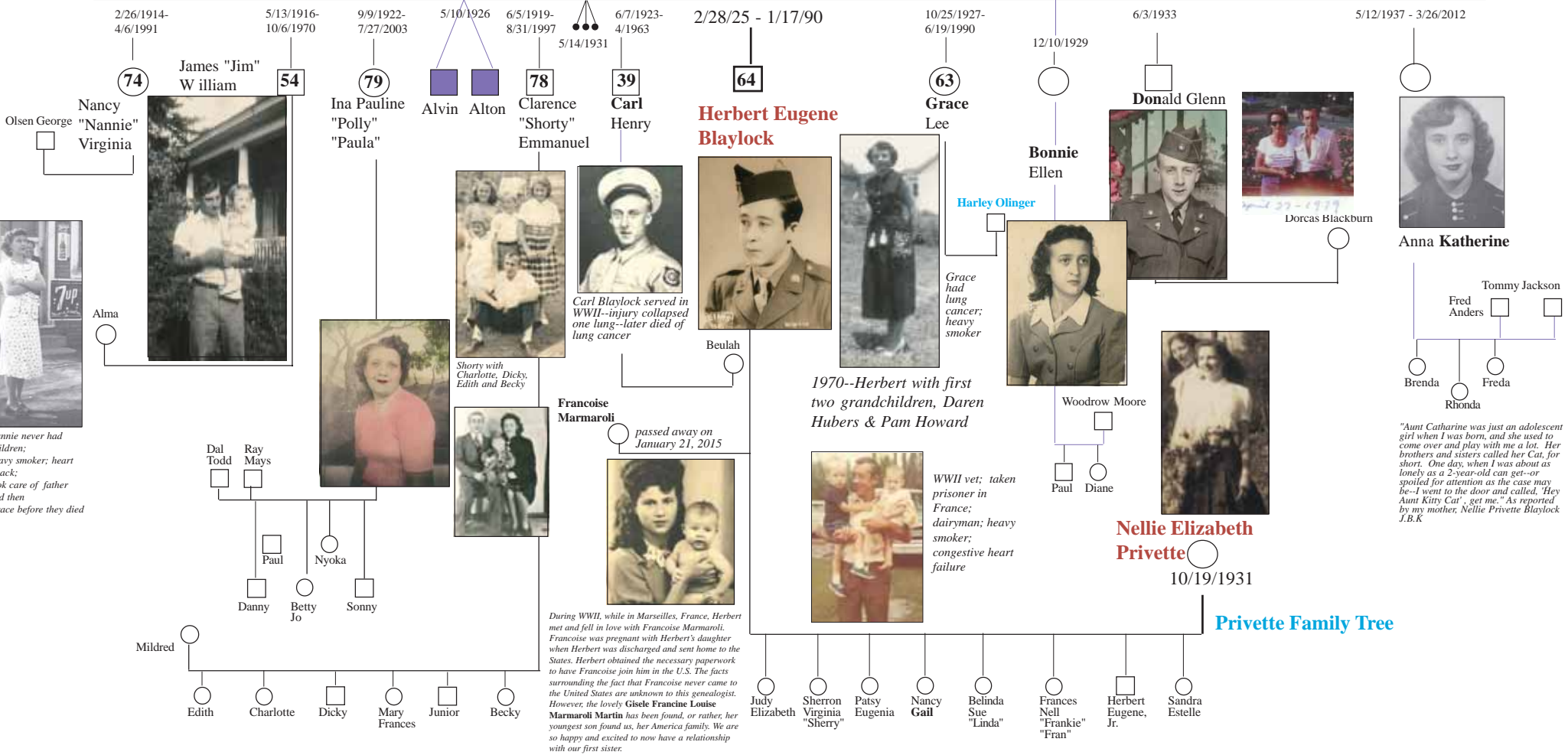

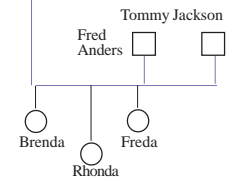
